
## Peer Bridge International Academy

## Educational philosophy

#### School features

#### 1. Enhanced career guidance

We conduct regular personal interviews at an early stage after admission. Students will have a specific vision of the future and will be motivated to learn if the person in charge understands each student's wishes and aptitudes, provides appropriate advice, and provides a wealth of information. Full-time instructors are university/graduate school experts with many years of teaching experience at universities, vocational schools, and Japanese language schools.

#### 2. Curriculum for improving task performance

The language skills required in modern society consists not only of how much grammar and vocabulary you know, but also what you can do with the language. In line with this trend, the school has set the goals of each course based on the CEFR (International standards for objectively describing foreign language proficiency). This not only allows students to achieve high-level results in entrance examinations and language examinations, but also helps them to understand their Japanese proficiency in comparison to international standards.

#### 3. Interaction with local communities

Our school emphasizes active involvement with the local community based on the idea that "the world's talents are those who can build rich human relationships in the society in which they live." In addition to participating in local events and volunteer activities, various cultural exchanges are planned so that students can use Japanese by enjoying cultural activities and having Japanese speakers participate in conversation classes.

#### 4. Top rate instructors

All of our instructors have passed the Japanese Language Proficiency Test and have a wealth of knowledge and teaching experience. Full-time instructors have taught for many years in Japanese language teacher training courses and are familiar with all fields of Japanese, including grammar, phonetics, pragmatics, linguistics, and pedagogy.
